SIGNS OF ELDER ABUSE

- Disclosure of verbal, physical, sexual or financial abuse, threats, intimidation, confinement/isolation and neglect;
- Physical injuries that are disclosed by the senior or are present and not explainable;
- The senior's physical presentation;
- Not leaving the senior alone to speak for themselves;
- Speaking for the senior;
- Concerns about the cost and benefit balance of family members living with senior as care provider;
- Missed appointments and indicators that prescriptions are not being administered and/or filled properly;

ELDER ABUSE RESPONSE TEAM

- Victim is 65yrs. or over and resides in Calgary with dependence on others for care and/or vulnerability;
- The alleged abuser is in a trusting relationship with the victim (domestic/family, formal agent/decision maker, caregiver);
- Criminal and/or high-risk elder abuse offence(s) has occurred or is occurring.



ELDER ABUSE SUPPORT TEAM

- Support clients who are 65 years of age and over, live in Calgary, and:
 - are experiencing abuse of a non-criminal nature, low-medium risk
 - are at risk of experiencing abuse
 - are in a relationship with the potential abuser
- Professional consultations/referrals
- Education & awareness



REPORTING ELDER ABUSE

Urgent:

911 emergency services

Non-Urgent:

- Calgary Police Service 403-266-1234
- Professional Consultation Line (carya): 403-705-7560
- Elder Abuse Resource Line (Kerby Centre): 403-705-3250

Frontline response is most appropriate to address immediate safety and investigative needs; EART is a specialty unit of the Calgary Police Service and as such normally responds after front line patrol attend;

EART is NOT a first response to incidents.



HOW ARE OLDER ADULTS PROTECTED?

There is currently no Elder Abuse specific legislation in Alberta

Older adults are protected under:

The Criminal Code of Canada
Prevention Against Family Violence Act
Adult Guardianship and Trusteeship Act
Protection for Persons in Care Act

With the exception of older adults receiving publicly funded care, there is no mandatory reporting for elder abuse at this time
